Reflection - Proclaiming the Gospel takes "Dedication"

This past Thursday, September 4th, we celebrated the dedication of our archdiocesan cathedral: Notre-Dame Cathedral Basilica. In the cathedral itself it would be celebrated as a **solemnity**, the highest form of liturgical celebration. That would be equal in a rank with some more of the well-known solemnities in our liturgical calendar such as All Saints Day (Nov. 1) or the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8). Outside of the cathedral itself, such as in the parishes across the archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall, it is celebrated as a feast day. We celebrate this feast in our parishes to evoke our connection with the nearly 120 parishes of the archdiocese as well as to our cathedral. Cathedrals are often considered the "Mother Church" of any diocese because they house the "cathedra," a Greek word for seat, or chair. The cathedral contains the seat of the archbishop, the one chosen by the Good Shepherd Himself through the Holy Spirit, to shepherd the Church in our local area. And so in celebrating this feast day, we remind ourselves of our communion with the Archbishop Marcel Damphousse and the entire Diocesan Church.

The question we might have is why the Church would invite us to commemorate a church building? After all, aren't they only buildings made of glass, wood, plaster, and stone? When we think of a feast day in the Church, we often associate them perhaps with a particular aspect of the life of Jesus, or the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the apostles and martyrs. The answer of course lies in what these edifices point towards. It is the same with any saint we commemorate. They all point to Jesus' saving work in the world. We do not commemorate a saint for their sake or for their own merits, but for how they help us and orient us towards living out and proclaiming the Gospel in our midst. Our church buildings help us to do the same. They are places of beauty and worship, places where the Gospel is proclaimed and preached, and places of encounter with our Lord Jesus in the sacraments.

Notre-Dame Cathedral Basilica in downtown Ottawa is one of the first Catholic churches in Ottawa. The construction of the stone building we see today began in 1841 and was complete enough for its dedication on September 4th 1853. However, for decades before, the stone church, a wooden church called St. James ,was in its place. It was a missionary parish from the Archdiocese of Kingston, meaning the Catholic Church was still in its infancy. Yet, over the years the stone church we see today was built and other parish churches were built to meet the needs the Catholic faithful in the area, and to boldly proclaim the Gospel.

Perhaps we may see a parallel between those early days of our diocese with our own local church here in Nepean. There is quickly growing population in our neighborhoods, and our parishes of St. Monica and St. Andrew serve nearly one tenth of the population of Ottawa. As we celebrate this dedication of Notre-Dame cathedral, may the Blessed Virgin Mary, Notre-Dame, the Star of the New Evangelization, help us to be completely dedicated to proclaiming the Gospel boldly in our own time and in our own area.
