

Deacon Tom's Thoughts

Third Sunday of Lent

As we journey through life we find ourselves yearning for acceptance. For love, someone to see us as we are and still love us unconditionally. This is a desire that transcends the boundaries of age, sex, status and gender.

Yet, we find ourselves dealing with feelings of inadequacy, comparing ourselves to others. There are voices of judgement and criticism that tell we are not good enough, smart enough, not successful enough. What happens? We build fences around ourselves, hiding our vulnerabilities from the scrutiny of others. We think that if others see us as we truly are, we would be seen as unworthy of love and acceptance.

Now let us consider a different reality, a different truth. One couched in the teachings of Jesus Christ. It is a truth in the eyes of Jesus that we are enough. This is a truth that is not dependent upon our lack of unworthiness, our accomplishments, our adherence as to how society sees us but a truth that inherently lies deep inside all of us. We are all children of God who love us unconditionally.

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus who helps to break down these barriers of division and exclusion. He reaches out to the Samaritan woman with compassion and grace. Despite the cultural differences that sought to marginalize her, Jesus sees beyond the surface and sees her as someone who is intrinsically worthy. He affirms her as a child of God. One who is worthy of love and acceptance.

Just as Jesus has reached out to the woman with arms wide open, he invites us to lay down those burdens of self-doubt and insecurity. He wants to take off the masks we wear to hide our vulnerabilities and to be open to the light of His love, His compassion, His acceptance of us as we are. He sees us as fully human, fully seen and fully loved. The love of Christ knows no bounds. It rises above our human limitations into the depths of our souls. It affirms our worthiness and we are called to share that same love with others.

If you are in our RCIA program know that you are accepted into our community not for what you should be, but for who you are. A child of God deserving His love and acceptance.

Let us all remember that in the eyes of God there are no outsiders, no unworthy souls. There is only boundless, never-ending unconditional love.

The prayer can be found in the iBreviary app. It will be projected on the big screen.


Joke of the Week
